



		This is a good time of year to take walks. Look at the trees and try to identify. There are finally leaves!				
		If they grow in your area, look for lupines. These are pretty and are a good example of a compound flower.				
				During this month there is an invasive blooming called Damesrocket. Try to find some. They grow best on disturbed ground, like the edges of roads.		
There are many wildflowers about now. Try to find a flower you haven't seen before, then identify it.		Try to use a dichotomous key. This works by answering specific questions to narrow down possibilities till you arrive at your plant.				If they grow in your area, try to find Jack-In-The-Pulpit. The outer part, what looks like a petal, is actually a modified leaf called the spathe. The inner part is called a spadix and is made up of many flowers.
